
Slide 3 Rapid recap of the Liturgical Year

Slide 4 The Sunday Readings for the season of Advent
 Work through each statement revealed and give children time to think about each one and share comments and questions they might have.
 Why do you think these readings are used during Advent?

Slide 5 Isaiah whose name means – God is salvation
 Use the post it notes to tell the story of Isaiah and his prophecies.
 Think about the fact he made his prophecies about Jesus 800 years before he was born and we are still learning about them today.
 Many of Isaiah's prophecies came to be in Jesus.

Slide 6 Year A Advent first readings are from the book of Isaiah
 Use the flip cards to read about Isaiah's prophecies.
 As you read each card think about whether Isaiah's prophecies have all come to pass.
 Note which ones Jesus fulfilled in his life.

Slide 7 Looking closely at Isaiah's messages in the Advent readings
 Work through each statement on the pop up and give children time to think about each one and share comments and questions they might have.
 Access the readings on the Teacher Resource from the Teacher's Book p. 12 or the lesson home page. Use these readings in class prayer during Advent.

Slide 8 Listen to our prophetic Pope who reminds us, as Isaiah did, to turn back to God
 Read the text on each image and discuss what Pope Francis is telling us.
 Follow the directions and discuss children's responses.

Slide 9 Expressing Advent themes in art works for your school to make Advent present

another Advent activity.




Slide 11 Time for Reflection
